Second Annual Swap Meet in Tulare, California, sponsored by the Horseless Carriage Club by Joe Davis


Lee Jackson and I took a long trip down to Tulare, California, for the second annual swap meet, put on by the Horseless Carriage Club. This event superseded the Bakersfield Meet, which had been happening for about 25 years, but ceased when the pandemic hit us. Tulare is a medium-sized farming community and the event was not only a Pre-War Swap Meet, but also an Antique Tractor event as well. We saw running tractors from the 1890's all the way to the 50's. Parades and lots of people cheering them on. We arrived a day early to see a collection located right in Tulare. It is called the Blain Foundation. The Blain family are avid collectors and also have a very nice restoration shop on 8 acres just on the edge of town. They love, race and restore early race cars(speedsters) and have quite a nice collection. See the photo below. The car in front is a 1914 Packard, believed to be a factory race car. It was originally shipped to Argentina for the race circuit down there, found in a field, in pretty bad shape, but mostly complete in the 1990's. The car behind it, is a 1911 National. This car had been a sedan in the day, was stripped down and converted into a speedster. A higher gear ratio was installed. It ran in the 1911 Indianapolis Race and placed seventh, driven by Charles Merz. In 1918, it was driven in the Santa Monica Road Races by Bill Cody. It is in pretty much un-restored condition, only the mechanicals have been restored. Everyone there got a ride in one of these cars. The engines are around 500 cubic inches and they really go. Pretty loud also, mufflers were an afterthought. The car is geared to make 100 MPH and both these cars are driven regularly in vintage racing events all over the country.

The 1928 Model A pickup was seen frequently around the swap meet, we loved the sign in the back.

2022 OREGON TOUR

COOS BAY, OREGON

JULY 7 - 10, 2022

Welcome old friends and new friends to the 2022 Oregon Tour which will be located in Coos Bay, Oregon and headquartered at the Edgewater Inn and Lucky Loggers RV Park. We will be touring for a short day Thursday afternoon, then two full days Friday, Saturday and a half day on Sunday. Tours will be through some beautiful back country of farms, woods and sea side on gentle country paved roads and very few hills.

Thursday, July 7th - Check-in for the "tour only" will be located at the Edgewater Inn in the "Garden Room" gathering at 12:00pm. The afternoon tour will be a short tour around the bay leaving about 2:30 and returning between 4:30 and 5:00. Brochures will be available to visit the local historic area, antique shops, and shopping in the local and unique shops. Thursday evening we will meet up and leave at 5:15pm for a get together banquet style dinner at the Puerto Vallarta Mexican Restaurant, 230 S. 2nd, Coos Bay. Your cost for the dinner is listed and covered with the application fees.





Friday, July 8th - The tour will be to Old Town Bandon via many scenic back roads. On the way we will stop for a coffee break. Lunch will be on your own in Bandon and there are many great options (over 15 to choose from). Right in Old Town Bandon is an amazing little historic museum, which tells of the story of Bandon and the huge fires that wiped it out... not once but twice. We will meet up after lunch and make our way back to Coos Bay returning between 3:00 & 3:30pm. **Mileage for the day is approximately 100 miles**. Dinner will be on your own Friday night. Coos Bay and North Bend have a wide variety of restaurants to enjoy. Don't hesitate to ask for recommendations from the locals.





Saturday, July 9th - The tour will be down to cities of Myrtle Point and Coquille. Myrtle Point has a very comprehensive logging museum. We will travel on many back roads and try to stay off the main highways and avoid the traffic. Half way there we will stop for a coffee break. After checking out down town Myrtle Point we will rejoin and head to Coquille where lunch will be on your own. After lunch we will all meet together and head back to Coos Bay again arriving around 3 to 3:30pm. Mileage is approximately 80-100 miles. Dinner on Saturday night is off the menu at the Coach House in what is called "Eastside" Coos Bay at your own expense.





Sunday, July 10th - Today's final tour is a half day tour (no coffee break) with meet up at 9:30am and then a drive to the coast and Shore Acres and Cape Arago. We will then work our way to Charleston and the harbor and then stop at the Marine Science Center, which is part of the University of Oregon. Upon completion of the tour, we will head back to the motel and arrive about 12:30 - 1:00pm. We can have lunch together before we depart for home. Mileage for Sunday is approximately 40 -50 miles. This will be the end of the Oregon Tour for 2022 and we hope you had a fun time and enjoyed everything.

The tour will be based out of the Edgewater Inn and the Lucky Loggers RV Park which are right next to each other.

You will need to call the Motel and the RV Park to make your reservations.

Motel Accommodations: Edgewater Inn, 275 E. Johnson Ave., Coos Bay, OR 97420, 541-267-0423 /800-233-0423. Ask for Angie Saxon, tell them you are with the antique car tour sponsored by the Southern Oregon Model T Club. The club has blocked quite a number or rooms for the tour. Rooms that are blocked, are in the Standard area of the motel and the rates are: 1 - 2 people \$122.00/night + 11% tax, 3 - 4 people are \$130.50/night + 11% tax. If you want to stay in the Waterside area of the motel and the rates are: 1 - 2 people \$130.50/night + 11% tax, 3 - 4 people \$139.50/night + 11% tax. If you want a room that will accommodate more people you will need to deal with Angie on those prices.

RV Accommodations: Lucky Loggers RV Park, 250 E. Johnson Ave., Coos Bay, OR 97420, 360-253-5603, Ext#2217. Ask for Jessica and tell her that you are with the antique car tour sponsored by the Southern Oregon Model T Club. The club has reserved 5 spaces, for which we had to pay \$100.00 deposit per space. On your tour application there will be a space for payment back to the club for the deposit. You will need to pay the difference above the \$100.00 deposit directly to the RV Park. Any questions on this please call Mike McKey at 541-944-6491 or email at mndmckey@msn.com. The rates are: \$50.00/night + \$5.50 tax (therefore if you stay 3 nights for the tour it would be a total of \$166.50 which includes the tax minus the \$100.00 deposit paid by and owed back to the club, for a total then to the RV Park of \$66.50)

Parking and unloading of the car trailers and or pickups if needed is at the back of the motel. The antique cars can then be parked next to the motel.


